

Code of Conduct for Young People

Roffey Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members. The Club believes that members, coaches, administrators and parents / carers and young people associated with the Club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Young people, whether playing or non-playing members of the Club, are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct that applies to all Members, in particular;

- All young people must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- All young people participating in cricket must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- Junior members must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions. Coaches and team managers will advise all junior members in their care as to what kit the Club will provide and what needs to be supplied by juniors.
- Young people should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coaching or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Juniors must pay any fees for training or matches promptly.
- Young people must use correct and proper language at all times.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on Club premises or whilst representing the Club in competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the Club premises or whilst representing the in competitions.
